For 50 years the Griffith Park Stables have offered guided horseback rides through the chaparral-covered canyons and manzanita forests of the 4,000-acre surrounding urban wilderness area, but they are closing their doors at the end of May when their lease expires. As departing owner Julie Schad notes, this is a unique spot for “regular people who want to be around a horse to experience the majesty—I call it the divinity—of a horse.” April 3, cowboy hats are optional.

House of Wax

This 1953 color 3-D horror film stars Vincent Price and is about a disfigured sculptor who repopulates his destroyed wax museum by murdering people and using their wax-coated corpses as displays. This film was the first color 3-D feature from a major American studio, and it had premiered just two days after the Columbia Pictures film *Man in the Dark*, the first major black-and-white 3-D feature film. In the 2014, *House of Wax* was deemed “culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant” by the Library of Congress and was selected for preservation in the National Film Registry.
