Poetry Corner

Pablo Neruda Friday, July 5 - 3:00 p.m.

Chilean poet Pablo Neruda, was born Ricardo Eliécer Naftalí Reyes Basoalto in the Linares Province of Chili. His father did not approve of his interest in writing and literature, so to avoid his father's disapproval of his work, he wrote under the pseudonym Pablo Neruda. By the time he was 19 years old, Neruda

had written Veinte poemas de amor y una canción desesperada (Twenty Love Poems and A Desperate Song), a collection of love poems that was controversial for its eroticism, considering the author's young age. By the age of 20, Neruda had established an international reputation as a poet, but faced poverty. Veine poemas eventually sold millions of copies and was translated into many languages, and over the years, it has become Neruda's best-known work. Almost one hundred years later, Veinte Poemas still is the best-selling poetry book in the Spanish language.

Neruda became a left-leaning intellectual and went on to live an intensely political life, serving in diplomatic posts in Buenos Aires, Barcelona, Spain, Mexico City,

and eventually France. He was a Communist Senator in Chili, and in 1970, was nominated as a candidate for the Chilean presidency. In 1971, Neruda was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature "for a poetry that with the action of an elemental force brings alive a continent's destiny and dreams."
