The Jewish High Holy Days begin with Rosh Hashanah that begins on Sunday, September 29th, and ends 11 days later on Tuesday, October 1st, when Yom Kippur ends at sundown. Jewish holidays always begin in the evening, so many celebrate Rosh Hashanah with a festive dinner with family and friends, and then attend services that evening and the following day. Throughout the centuries, Jews have practiced an Ashkenazic tradition of commonly eating apples dipped in honey at Rosh Hashanah, as this act symbolizes the hope for sweetness and blessings for all humankind in the year ahead.

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
